<ul style="list-style-type: none">- A B1 Spanish level is highly recommended. No certification is required.- We kindly ask our partners to respect the bilateral agreement signed between our institutions, regarding not only the number of students exchanged but also the length of the stay.- All our subjects consist of both, a theoretical and a practical part. To do only the practical part of one subject will not be possible.- Students have to select the whole subject on their Learning Agreement. They also will have to do the exam of the whole subject. It will not be possible to evaluate only some part(s) of the subject.- It is compulsory to participate in the exam of each subject included in the Learning Agreement.- Given that our subjects are evaluated with a single final mark (which takes into account student achievements in theoretical and practical competences) (see <i>guía docente</i>), clinical practice certificates (or any other kind of certification apart from the final subject mark) will not be delivered.
